POSITION SUMMARY

The Institutional Funding Officer is responsible for managing all aspects of Aperture's portfolio of institutional partners, and devises and implements strategic approaches to secure relationships with institutional collaborators to achieve annual operating goals. This position reports to the Director of Development and jointly supervises a Development Coordinator and a Work Scholar.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Serve as the primary contact and relationship manager to corresponding contacts
- Develop an institutional fundraising strategy in collaboration with Director of Development and the Executive Director
- Manage a portfolio of existing and new foundation donors, creating opportunities to engage new foundation donors
- Carry out research and capitalize and disseminate information on institutional funders, opportunities, guidelines, and strategies
- Project manage complex proposals and reports and ensure timely submission to funders, working across the organization with program and development staff
- Maintain foundation donor information in Salesforce database
- Develop and track annual forecast for institutional advancement and report on progress quarterly to Board Development Committee and to the Board of Trustees

- Excellent writing skills and interpersonal skills
- 4+ years of experience in a fundraising operation and proven success in grant fundraising
- Grant writing experience with a successful record of securing foundation grants for publishing, arts, and/or cultural institutions
- Strong interpersonal and relationship skills with the ability to work and collaborate across teams
- Outstanding organizational skills, including ability to plan, prioritize and manage a varied workload to meet deadlines
- Experience with Raiser's Edge or Salesforce database or similar fundraising software important, and working with budget and other financial documents required for grant submissions; and proficiency in Microsoft Office (Excel, Word, PowerPoint)
